ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING EASTER OFFERING

Since 1949 Presbyterians have joined with millions of other Christians through One Great Hour of Sharing to share God's love with those in need. Your generous gifts assist those affected by natural disasters, provide food to the hungry, and assist in helping to empower the poor and oppressed.

The offering will be received on Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter. This offering will help support Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Self-Development of People (SDOP) program which provides grants for projects that are owned and controlled by the people who will benefit directly from them. Each project must address and correct long-term conditions that keep people bound by poverty and oppression. It will also help support the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program and the Presbyterian Hunger Program. MARCH 14, 2017 SESSION SUMMARY

We are very excited to announce that **Rev. Dr. Peggy Hinds** will be helping lead the discernment process **to help our congregation take faithful steps into the future.**

An ordained Teaching Elder and Certified Christian Educator in the Presbyterian Church (USA), Rev. Hinds serves as the Interim Executive Director of the Kentucky Council of Churches. She began her work with us by meeting with the session in March and scheduling a congregational gathering on Saturday, April 22nd. Please plan on attending. Our hope is to have the highest level of participation possible.

We need your input for the process to be successful. And, we need God's guidance! We will also be forming prayer partnerships –two to three people who commit to pray together:

- For the congregation,
- For the leadership,
- For the Spirit's leading through this process,
- For all outcomes to be in line with God's will for the church.

This is not only a highlight of a session meeting –but a highlight for our congregation this year. This discernment process will also include:

- Small group studies (sharing resources about visioning, gifts assessment, systems theory, vocation/call, community outreach, evangelism, etc.)
- Conversation groups (prayer gatherings, dinners, game nights, etc.)

Personal visits (meeting with individual members/families about the importance of their participation in the process.)

By the end, the congregation will have a clearer vision for the future, and steps for mission and ministry that people are excited about taking.

Desired outcomes for the discernment process include:

Bring people closer to God through the church.
 The process will clarify our congregational eagerness and energy to accept change as a means of engaging with new people.

A Needed Conversation for all Christians!

Talk about criminal justice reform is at a high. Much of this focuses on the costliness of our current system. While economics matter, many Christians wonder, "Where do God and ethics fit in?"

In this roundtable workshop, participants will question the popular practice of justice and explore alternatives that are rooted in Christian theology. Compassion, restoration, and communion will be guiding emphases. The workshop is also set to engage highly relevant issues, such as:

Mass incarceration: poverty and race "Treating" drug addiction with punishment The collateral consequences of conviction Kentucky-specific problems and solutions

<u>News from Highlands Community Ministries</u> – Did you know...?

- HCM's Highlands Youth Recreation is partnering with Kentucky Refugee Ministries, sponsoring 25 refugee children to participate in HYR sports teams free of charge. Volunteers are needed to help transport children to Saturday games. Call HCM is you can help.
- Senior Adult Day Health Care has moved to sunnier, more spacious quarters at the Altenheim. A Grand Opening is being planned for some time in May.
- Around 250 children are served each month in Child Care programs at three sites.
- In the Individual and Family Assistance Program (IFAP), over 200 households have used the Food Pantry each month so far in 2017. Volunteers are needed to assist in the food pantry.

HCM FIRST SUNDAY DONATIONS

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE

This spring **Mid Kentucky Presbytery** churches are participating in a Presbyterian Disaster Assistance project. Churches are asked to collect hygiene supplies and pack hygiene kits to assist people whose communities are devastated by flood, fire, and tornado, with a goal of 1,000 hygiene kits. **The project will be part of Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer's Give a Day week of caring in April 2017.**

There are three ways you can help:

- Send a check for supplies to Strathmoor Presbyterian Church, 2201 Hawthorne Ave., Louisville, KY 40205 by <u>April 1</u>. Write Disaster Kits on the memo line. Volunteers will purchase the supplies needed.
- Bring supplies and/or completed kits to Strathmoor on Monday, April 24, from 10 A.M. to 1 P.M. Please deliver items in the cardboard boxes in which reams of paper are sold. 80-100 boxes will be needed. To prepare each kit, we need:
 - One gallon ziplock bag
 - Wash cloth
 - Hand towel
 - 10 bandaids
 - Toothbrush in original package
 - Bath-size bar of unscented soap in original wrapper
 - Nail clipper
 - Wide-tooth comb
- Help assemble hygiene kits on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 29</u>, from 1 – 3 P.M. at Strathmoor.

*If desired, checks and items may be brought to BRP, and delivery to Strathmoor will be arranged.

By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶ In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, ⁷ so that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. ⁸ Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, ⁹ for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

Directions

From I-64, take the Grinstead Dr. exit and then turn (left if coming from I-64W, or right if coming from I-64E) onto Grinstead Dr. Take a left (almost immediately) at the light onto Lexington Rd. Take the next right into the park. The road will eventually turn into a one-way scenic loop. Follow this loop to the top of the second hill to Hogan's Fountain.

From I-65, take the exit for Eastern Pkwy and follow it to the east over Bardstown Rd. until it "dead ends" at a traffic circle at the entrance to the park. Go "straight" through the traffic circle and get on the one-way scenic loop. Hogan's Fountain will be at the top of the next hill.
