Dear Beloved,

I am excited to be joining you in ministry at Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church. Being your Transitional Pastor is a great joy. There is no place I would rather be! I am grateful to all of you for inviting me to be your Transitional Pastor. As many of you know, Louisville KY is my home, but I was not privileged to be born here. I was born far away in Berlin Germany, the second child of missionary parents. My parents took us to Beirut, Lebanon before bringing us to Louisville, Kentucky. The magnificent trees in Louisville made a lasting impression on me. I thought I had entered an enchanted forest when my mother first walked us from our home on Gresham Road to Belknap Elementary School. We soon moved just up the street from Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church on Casselberry Rd. I grew up roaming Cherokee Park with my brothers, coasting down the hills in the winter snow and fishing off of Big Rock. My parents gave us bikes when we first moved to Louisville and we rode them everywhere! I can see myself on my bike straining to make it all the way up Speed Avenue's hill on my way to Highland Junior High School. (I still know the fight song!). My brothers and I would always look up longingly at Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church's beautiful windows and inviting doors. I was thrilled to be invited to attend youth group meetings in its spacious fellowship hall; worshipping, laughing and dancing with other Presbyterian kids. We followed most of our Highland friends to Atherton for High School. I woke up early to practice with the Atherton Swim team and stayed late to practice with the Field Hockey team. I have to admit, that as much as I loved swimming and running, I was the weakest member of both teams. Just being allowed to join the teams was happiness enough.

Sunday's found us all at Second Presbyterian Church where we watched the transformation of the Church Building from a beautiful chapel to a majestic sanctuary. My heart goes back to that chapel, the wonderful people I knew and the support and love I felt! In worship, as nowhere else, I was challenged, I was loved, I was secure, I was at home! . As a child and teenager I took the beauty of this lovely city for granted. I now know what a gift it is.

I left Louisville after High School to return two years ago. In the "between-time" I have lived all over the world: Boston, MA; Princeton NJ; Heidelberg Germany, Roanoke, Virginia; Houston, Texas; and most recently, the Philippines. I spent that time being a student, a pastor, a friend, a Christian Educator, a Campus Minister, a Professor and a devoted member of vibrant local churches. I was invited to join our brothers and sisters around the world in ministry. I



No matter where I was in the world, I knew the Church was my home. I never worried about getting lost or feeling alone because the arms of the Church surrounded me. I knew that if ever I was in danger, and I was in danger more than once, I could turn to pastors, church members and friends both here and abroad. The love that is the "calling card" of the Church, the devotion to all its members, and the happiness that is lived in the Church has fed me, comforted me and lifted me up.

It was the love of family drew us back home. My mother was severely ill and I was blessed to be able to be with her and guide her steps in her final years. I was with her through many doctor's visits, hospital operations, and rehabilitation centers. I held her hand as she took her final breath and accompanied her body during its final moments.

All of these memories came to mind as I drove along the Ohio River and into the Indiana farm country this past Sunday. I often preach at Elizabeth and Laconia IN, and love and cherish these wonderful congregations.



We welcome Louisville Home School again for another school year as a part of the BRP Ministry and Mission!

Louisville Homeschool's cottage program is dedicated to enhancing homeschooler's educational opportunities by exposing children to creative learning experiences in various subjects. Our goals are to foster a lifelong love of learning, to teach and demonstrate acceptance for all people, to positively enrich the lives of homeschoolers, and provide excellent educational opportunities. LHCP is an inclusive, secular cottage program that welcomes all homeschoolers.

Our program is on Tuesdays and Thursdays on floors 2 & 1/2 from 9 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. We have a 30 minute lunch in Fellowship Hall at noon. Each child has different lunch chores including sweeping, wiping tables, and doing the dishes. This year, our classes include Art, Journalism, STEM challenges, Music, Band, ASL, Women's History, Literature, Reading Skills, Yearbook, Kentucky History, and many more!
