

THANK OFFERING—November 18

Starting back in 1888 Presbyterian Women (and now men) have raised tens of millions of dollars for worthwhile mission projects. This offering gives us a tangible way to express gratitude for the special blessings in our lives. Due to generous giving in 2017, the Creative Ministries Offering Committee was able to choose 16 projects out of 83 submitted. Grants ranging from 5,000 to 50,000 dollars were given to national and 4 international projects. International were to Guatemala, Sudan, Egypt and Indonesia. All 16 are posted in Fellowship Hall. The variety of needs is interesting. Please check out where your gifts are being used this year. Three others that especially pleased me are: (1) Arroyo Grande, California to purchase mobile showers for the homeless and initiating this service; (2) Golden, Colorado's Good Neighbor Garage that repairs donated cars giving them to low/fixed income to single mothers and widows. They provide maintenance, train mechanics and hold clinics on car care; (3) and one close to home is in Lexington, KY. Their grant will purchase a refrigerated food truck. This will allow the Lighthouse Ministries to safely transport food from groceries and restaurants to impact the hunger community.

Think about how much you appreciate your shower, your car and your good food. Each little bit of money adds up to a massive amount of good. The grants given this year totaled almost 400,000 dollars.

Our offering will be dedicated on Sunday November 18th but you may mail in your gift to church at any time. What is given now determines what will be granted for 2019. May God bless our efforts in helping with worldwide needs.

OCTOBER 16, 2018 SESSION SUMMARY From Rev. Mary Nebelsick

BRPC's Session met on October 16, 2018 in the Club Room at 7pm. The meeting opened with singing and prayer.

The Rev. Mary Nebelsick summarized her written report which included dates on which she preached (Sept, 30, Oct. 7 and Oct. 14) and the number of Home Communions served as well as visitations to members in care facilities. The Rev. Nebelsick continues to host homeless community members who come to the building to share food and cold water, to power their cell phones, to participate in a caring moment. She is also actively involved in caring for our Youth and their families. She provided the Session with a summary of the many ways in which the BRPC facility was used by various groups. In addition to the regular use of the BRPC by the BRPC Congregation, 19 Groups and approximately 400 persons used the building and grounds in October. This is a phenomenal ministry to the wider community!

For the month, the church's operating budget had receipts of \$25,237.75 with expenses of \$19,567.94. Year to date the income is \$163,394.85 with expenses of \$154,822.03, leaving a surplus of \$8,572.82.

John Elgin, chair of the Building and Grounds committee. Llester Gamble and Doug Rapp, members of the B&G committee have surveyed the facility to access the need for new keys. Since new keys are being issued and BRPC is anxious to provide as much space to as many community groups as possible, each group will be asked to fill out three documents: a building use contract, a release of indemnity and a document outlining the policy rules and regulations established by the Session of BRPC. Contacting each group individually will provide the pastor the opportunity to reconnect with each group to express BRPC's support of their ministry and mission and provide any pastoral care needed. The Session voted to approve these documents and their use.

BRPC is happy to welcome our new Sexton Darrius Duett. He began work at the beginning of October.

The Joseph Schnurr Company will begin work on the ceiling repair on October 22, 2018. The company will patch and repair the ceiling with a laminate to keep the area from failing again in the near term. The company will check other areas of the ceiling that may need to be repaired as well.

The Christian Education Committee reported on their many meetings and gave an update on the All Church Retreat that was held at Cedar Ridge on October 6, 2018. The Retreat was a success! All kids had a great time!

Transporting all the kids to all the events that the CE Committee wishes to host continues to be a problem. The CE Committee is seeking input on how best to provide the needed transportation. The possibility of a van was discussed in light of the vans that have been owned by BRPC in the past.

Siram Coalter our Youth Coordinator reported on the Sunday School and Youth Events planned for October and early November. Our youth will be busy!

The Worship Committee discussed the worship schedule in light of the ceiling repair. BRPC is planning to worship in the Fellowship Hall on Oct. 21 and Oct. 28 and possibly Nov. 4. We will welcome Jacob Coalter, son of Martha Claire Coalter, grandson of Lin Block-Coalter and nephew of Siram Coalter into the BRPC family through the sacrament of baptism on Nov. 18, 2018.

The Congregational Life Committee continues to visit homebound individuals as well as nursing care facility residents on the second Friday of each month. Birthday Cards will continue to be sent out with much love. An after worship potluck will be held on November 4, 2018. The talk to be given by Gail Hinson will be held at a later date.

The Mission Committee reported that the Presbyterian Habitat House was dedicated on October 13, 2018. HCM held its empty bowls event at Bellarmine University on Oct. 11. The closure meeting for BRPC, 1st Presbyterian Church Shelbyville and 1st Christian Church Shelbyville will take place on Nov. 5, KIPL will hold its Monarch Butterfly Waystation gathering on Nov. 8., Project Warm will begin again in Nov.3. The voter registration table at the Farmer's Market on Sept. 15 and 22 was a success. BRPC will invite Pastor Elmer Zavala pastor of Preston Highway Ministry has been invited to speak to the Mission Committee at their next meeting.

The Mission display case near the Fellowship Hall is being utilized to highlight activities of the Mission Committee. Cedar Ridge Camp is highlighted in October and into November. Heiffer International will be highlighted beginning in mid-November.

The Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering will be collected on Nov. 18, 2018.

The next Mid-Kentucky Presbytery Meeting will take place on Nov. 2 & 3, 2018 at the Presbyterian Church of Danville It will be a Tri-Presbytery Meeting Transylvania, Mid-Kentucky and Western Kentucky Presbyteries Stronger Together, Reclaiming Common Ground: Presbyterians Responding to the Needs of Kentucky

The meeting ended with singing and prayer.

It is the season of stewardship where we pledge our time, talents, and treasure to the continuing operation of God's Church. As Lin noted in her letter to the members of our congre-




gation, our church and our stewardship has touched many people in our community. The continuing impact depends upon our involvement and commitment to keeping the church available.
