SESSION HIGHLIGHTS SEPTEMBER 18

A Motion was made and approved that the Christian Education Committee draft a proposal regarding the qualifications and expectations of candidates for confirmation. A Confirmation class in early 2019 is indicated.

Dr. Robert Bozeman, church organist and pianist as well as Certified Spiritual Director has requested to utilize BRPC as a venue for three classes: Bones for Life, Artist's Way, and the Labyrinth. All three classes would be open to the BRPC congregation as well as the community. A Motion is made and approved that the Chair of

Buildings and Grounds will develop a written agreement with Dr. Bozeman.

The baptism of Jacob Coalter, infant son of M. Claire Coalter is approved for Sunday, November 18, 2018 as requested by the parent.

In absence of Llester Gamble, Chair, the Rev. Nebelsick conveys to the Session the request for a **Congregational Meeting on September 30, 2018** to approve the slate presented for the Pastoral Nominating Committee.

There was a theft of multiple items from the church office on either September 4, or September 5, 2018.

Committee members are working with insurance company representatives as well as staff of Advanced Business Solutions, a technology consulting company. Willis Klein Locksmiths has already rekeyed all outer doors. Inner doors will also be rekeyed. The plan is to decrease the number of master keys in circulation. Replacement materials are on order. Since the burglary was accomplished via key access and was obviously planned, additional security mechanisms have been implemented.

The assessment by the John Schnurr Company of the ceiling damage in Sanctuary is scheduled. This damage is due to vibration of the building, rather than water leakage, so there will not be insurance coverage. Removal of pews will be necessary to allow access to the ceiling area for repair and painting.

The motion is made and approved that donations for the relief efforts due to Hurricane Florence will be solicited and directed through the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program.

Candidates for the Sexton position are currently being interviewed.

October 13, 2018 is the next scheduled church work day.

Autumn under the Cedars, a fundraising event for Cedar Ridge Camp, is scheduled for October 13, 2018.

Empty Bowls, a yearly event sponsored by Highland Community Ministries, is scheduled for October 4, 2018.

The Fifth Sunday Offering on September 30, 2018 is designated for Project Warm which starts on November 11, 2018.

Support services continue to the resettled Burmese family who unfortunately experienced water in the basement of the rental house.

Stewardship Sunday is scheduled for September 30, 2018. John Elgin will assist Lin Block-Coalter in planning and executing the Stewardship campaign. **It has been rescheduled.**



Does the thought of talking with your family about the end of life or death seem difficult or something you want to avoid? Friends can help each other with these difficult but necessary conversations!

Let's get together November 4 for an interactive workshop addressing end-of-life issues. Through this workshop, you will be given some tools to help think through conversations about living well to the end and gathering important information about your wishes and your affairs that you can give to your family or trusted friends.

Some of the topics this workshop will cover include identifying our own hesitancies in talking about end of life with family or friends, starting difficult conversations, and identifying financial, physical, emotional, and spiritual matters that are essential to share. After doing these workshops for 14 years, I have developed some worksheets that you can use in your own way and share with your family or executors. These worksheets can consolidate your personal wishes and information as well as the Kentucky living will documents. There was even a little excitement to add spice to the day! One of the workers smelled a natural gas odor, and called LG&E. They responded with equipment and emergency workers, shut down the street, and began looking for the leak. All workers we're sent home early, which was o.k., since a big thunderstorm was on the way! PROJECT WARM- November 3

Since fall is here, can winter be far behind? Winter means cold temperatures and high heating bills, which can be a burden for families with limited income.

Fortunately, Project Warm is a local nonprofit that helps our neighbors by reducing high bills by making houses more energy efficient. The techniques are simple and involve adding plastic window coverings over drafty windows.

The BRP team is now getting organized for the Project Warm Blitz on November 3. During the Blitz, dozens of teams go around the city to work with homeowners. Over 300 families benefit from the Blitz!
