As we head into the fall and a brand new year with new experiences, let me send you all out with a charge that may be very familiar to you. You will remember that a charge is a statement of encouragement to live the Christian life - not just on Sunday morning (or afternoon), but each day. As Christians we gather, study, pray, and witness together and then we leave to continue with our lives; we do this centered around a *charge* that commends to us a particular way of living.

Go out into the world in peace; have courage; hold on to what is good; return no one evil for evil; strengthen the fainthearted; support the weak, and help the suffering; honor all people; love and serve the Lord, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit.

You may recognize the words because you have heard this charge, or you may recognize it because it comes from the Bible, though from several different places. It is drawn from the life of Jesus and the teaching of the Apostle Paul and Peter. The Presbyterian Book of Common Worship cites First Corinthians, Second Timothy, Ephesians, First Thessalonians, and First Peter as some of the sources. Presbyterians have been using this charge for more than a century, though the earliest reference I know of is from a 19th century Episcopalian church manual.

In a world that can sometimes seem unrecognizable as we hear story after story about meanness or worry, remember that the Bible offers you a beautiful, hard, inspiring, funny, sad, loving story to live from. So go do it, and maybe if we live out this charge we can rejoice in the telling of new and different stories.

Capital Improvements Around the Church

It may not be noticeable to you as you look at the church but several major projects were completed on the exterior of the church. We had a brick mason work for two weeks on several areas: bricks tuck-pointed, windows caulked, bricks power washed and waterproofed and other details to stop moisture coming into the building that was causing interior painting to blister and peel.

With this work, we will be ready for the installation of the solar panels when they are ready to be installed. The next project to take place is the painting of portions of the sanctuary ceiling as we are now confident that the work done will prevent future problems. Hopefully, this will be done in the month of September. We hope to continue work around the church both inside and out to work towards a more inviting church. At the end of August all candidates for Transitional Pastor will have been heard. The committee has met, done additional phone interviews as needed, and hope to have a contract signed by mid-September or first of October 2017.

Kids Club dates are: September 20, October 18, November 15, and December 20.



Vacation Bible School 2017: We Did It!

Our Vacation Bible School program with Bardstown Rd. Presbyterian and Immanuel Church of Christ was a big success. Our 24 adult and youth volunteers worked hard and well together to create a fun and enriching experience for all 29 children who participated.

Each morning a Bible story was shared highlighting ways our Super Heroes could discover their strength in God. Afterwards, the three groups of children rotated through activities which included music, crafts, snacks, recreation, and reflection time. The story for the day was discussed, and interactive activities helped the message come alive for the children. Everyday we focused on a different action word for God's Heroes: heart, courage, wisdom, hope, and power. Our hero verse for the week was from Psalms 34:14b "Do good! Seek peace, and go after it!

On Monday, God called Samuel to anoint David the King. He reminded us that we can't always see what God sees in us and others. Making tie dyed super hero capes, singing the Hero pledge, running spooning heart relays, and eating super peace pizza showed us that God sees inside our hearts and teaches us to love one another.

On Tuesday, God called Abigail to save the day. She brought food to David's men and supported peace. Playing team games, working together to solve tasks, making glass votive lights, singing Superheroes, and enjoying pretzel stick and grape weights for snack allowed us to let our courageous light shine for God.

On Wednesday, God called Jesus to the Temple. Though just a boy at the time, Jesus showed an impressive level of wisdom and understanding. Designing shields and symbols on their capes, singing Hear us as We Pray, eating Krypton bars, and playing the mystery bucket game taught us that God gives us wisdom to make us stronger and able to understand things.

On Thursday, God called Jesus to share the sermon on the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes offer hope to those who need it the most. Creating superhero plaques, playing games where we help one another, and singing the song One of a Kind showed us how to rise above struggles to find hope with one another and in God's love.

On Friday, God called Jesus' disciples to hear the story of Pentecost. We learned that God sent the Holy Spirit and its power to all of us that believe the good news. After story time we traveled to Hogan's Fountain in Cherokee Park, picking up trash as a way to serve God and beautify our surroundings. We also enjoyed a time to play and picnic together.
