In Game of Thrones, "Winter is Coming!" is the motto of House Stark. It is meant as a word of warning There will be a Brainstorming Breakfast on to be prepared for what we know is coming.

On each of the Lord's Days in December we reminded ourselves that "Advent means coming." Our experience of Advent leads us to Christ and into the church season of Epiphany (which begins on the 12th day of Christmas, January 6th).

Epiphany is a season of discovery, dawning awareness, and recognition that God is lord of all. Winter (in the dark and cold days of January) is the perfect time for an "I love the warmth, support and fellowship of the Epiphany. Winter is the time we mostly see gloom and loss and despair. Yet, beyond our eyes, we know that there are unseen forces leading to springtime growth and summer harvests. God is God. And, God is at work in the world.

Even in winter there are many signs of new life in and around BRPC. People care for others. Our children are growing into the future with faith and hope and love. Our elders are dreaming dreams for a vibrant future.

One specific example: the session in December established a budget that includes every expense our ministry teams dreamed about for the coming year. (Let that sink in for a moment). That is quite a step of faith considering that our income projections are down. Yet, no ministry requests were cut. It's not our business to make money . . . It's our role –and reflects our desire—to give ourselves for the proclamation of the gospel and for sharing God's love in the world. Rather than cut any ministry requests, the session chose to use money from "savings" for such a time as this. Fearful elders would not do that. Perfect love casts out fear (1st John 4:18). Our faith leads us to invest in the future with hope and love.

You'll hear –and begin to glimpse– a bit of the new beginnings that are stirring among us in the new year.
