Everyone would join for the last verse,

"Let us praise God together on our knees, (2x) When I fall on my knees with my face to the rising sun,

O Lord, have mercy on me.

The next time I heard this hymn was during the celebration of the Lord's Supper. The beauty of the music and words continues to feed my soul. What is your favorite Communion hymn? What is Your favorite Communion memory? Let us talk about them and rejoice!

CHURCH VITALITY SURVEY

The Church Vitality Survey is coming to BRP Church.

The Mid-Kentucky Presbytery has been selected as the pilot Presbytery to conduct a survey of our 52 congregations. The survey's purpose is to measure the vitality of the Presbyterian congregations regarding their life and mission.

There are separate surveys for the session and staff and for the congregation to fill out. You will be receiving the surveys in the mail soon and it will take 20 well-spent minutes to complete the forms. They need to be mailed back to the church by January 10, 2018 in a self-addressed stamped envelope provided by the church.

Your responses will be kept confidential and the collective results will be shared at the February 10, 2018 Presbytery Meeting as well as with our church. This information will be a useful means to discern the ways in which the Holy Spirit is moving through our congregations.

DECEMBER 19th SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Laura Stone did the opening devotion on the difference between wishing and hoping and that we need to be more hopeful.
- Rev. Mary Nebelsick gave her Moderator's Report about the church activities and home visits she has been involved with. She encouraged committee leaders to focus their discussions and bring their written committee reports to the Session meetings.
- A motion was approved for Rev. Nebelsick to participate in a pulpit exchange with another church on February 11, 2018 to foster community life.
- A Church Vitality Survey sponsored by the Presbyterian Mission Agency will be completed by our session, staff and congregation in early January to discern the vitality of our congregations.
- The church roll of active members was reviewed with the current total of 87 members acknowledging the passing of Betty Eigelbach.
- The November budget showed a \$9,201 deficit of expenses exceeding income but a year to date surplus of \$11,041. There is a chance that a transfer of money from the Restricted Funds account will not be necessary for the fourth quarter.
- New large print hymnals will be purchased thanks to an offer from Jim Brees. The large pulpit bible, recently discovered, will be dedicated at the January 7, 2018 service.
- The Youth have been staying between the church service and the evening Youth group having lunch, tutoring and play activities under Brittany Hesson's supervision. This "All Day Church" program has helped the transportation situation.
- A potluck supper for Peggy Hinds, a follow-up for our discernment process, is tentatively planned for January 28, 2018 for the entire congregation.
- The dedication of the solar panels was held in the club room on December 10, 2017 with Rev. Nebelsick conducting the blessing.
- The church van has been sold.
- Repairs have been made to the steam pipes in the ladies restroom and sub-basement.

- A new custodian, Edward Krieg (Woody), has been hired and he has a background in remodeling and plumbing maintenance. His hours will be 9:00 a.m.to 1:00 p.m. five days a week.
- Doug Rapp presented the 2018 preliminary operating budget. Proposed income and expenses were reviewed. With the commitment pledges down, several budget alternatives were suggested. The session will review the proposed 2018 budget for final approval at the January meeting.
- Rev. Nebelsick presented an American cross that will be displayed at future session meetings. A hymn was sung to close the meeting.

The January Kids Club will be Wednesday, January 17. We'll meet on the 3rd floor at 5:30 p.m. for dinner and a movie night.




