

## SESSION HIGHLIGHT FOR FEB. 20, 2018

- Carol Brees led the devotional study about consideration for our church to be a community building.
- Rev. Mary Nebelsick gave the Moderator's Report with the theme "Be Thou Thy Vision." Linda White will assist Mary with organizing the church archives. To respect current diversity and be more welcoming the bathroom signage was suggested to be more inclusive.
- A tentative date of May 19 for a Session Retreat to begin the process to define our mission and for calling a permanent pastor.
- A motion was approved to reduce the future Session classes from four to three elders. Doug Rapp and Lin Block-Coalter will assist in getting names of people to serve on the Elder Nominating Committee.
- A Congregational Meeting will be March 11, 2018 to elect the Nominating Committee to fill the openings for three in the Class of 2021 for three years and one in the Class of 2019 for one year.
- Brittany Hesson reported that the youth have made suggestions for the qualities for our next Youth Director.
   BRP church will contact the LPTS Field Ed. Office for summer assistance. Mary's daughter, Rachel, has offered to help with the youth during summer.
- Keith Clements stated that in the Clerk's Report there
  were 23 responses from the congregation for the Vitality
  Survey. Preliminary results from 52% of the
  congregations in our Mid-Kentucky Presbytery indicate
  that the churches are strong in caring relationships but
  weak in intentional evangelism.
- The February 10, 2018 Presbytery meeting was at Springfield Presbyterian Church. The responses from the new candidates for ministry were impressive.
- Ten large print hymnals have been ordered as well as current copies of the Book of Order for use by the Session.
- The baptism for Mary Caroline Purnell-Gatewood will be March 18, 2018 with baroque music accompaniment.
- Future Sunday services will begin with a procession during the prelude that will include the lighting of the candles, the Liturgist opening the Bible and the Pastor pouring water into the Baptismal Font. The large fabric cross, made by Beverly Gradisek, will be displayed behind the altar during Lent.
- A Voter Registration table will be set up on several Saturdays in April during the Farmer's Market.

## ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING EASTER OFFERING

Since 1949 Presbyterians have joined with millions of other Christians through One Great Hour of Sharing to share God's love with those in need. Your generous gifts assist those affected by natural disasters, provide food to the hungry, and assist in helping to empower the poor and oppressed.

The offering will be received on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. This offering will help support Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Self-Development of People (SDOP) program which provides grants for projects that are owned and controlled by the people who will benefit directly from them. Each project must address and correct long-term conditions that keep people bound by poverty and oppression.
