Let's Grow! Let's Evangelize!

Numbers are great. They can tell us a lot about our health and our wealth. One of the significant numbers in Church Vitality Studies is the number 100. If a Church has 100 active members then it has a good chance of being able to continue to minister to the community. If it has less than 100 then the Church should take a look at its ministry priorities and ask, "Do we want to grow?" "If we do want to grow what kind of evangelism efforts will we undertake so that we have a chance of growing."

Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church has 87 active members. To get to the "magic 100" we need 13 new members. Does BRPC want to grow? If BRPC wants to grow, what kind of evangelism efforts will we undertake so that we have a chance of growing?

What is the heart of BRPC's spiritual DNA? What do we value most? What is at the heart of our mission? What are our core passions and commitments?

How do we invite people to join us at BRPC so that we can follow Christ together?

Do our values flow from encountering the risen, resurrected Christ? Do we invite people to come and touch and see Jesus with us?

How central to our ministry is encountering the risen Jesus? How central to our message is inviting people to join us in encountering the risen Jesus?

How do we witness to being more than a religious social club in which we can all get together with people who have similar outlooks on life and create a close knit community?

How do we witness to being more than a social service center in which we're trying to help people and correct the problems and injustices of the world?

How do we witness to being more than a society of religious rituals where we gather to sing and pray, and ask God's blessing on our children when they're baptized, or on them when they get married, or over our loved ones when they die and pass away?

The faith we profess at BRPC is about an encounter with Jesus Christ, and if we don't encounter Jesus while we are involved in all these other activities, then we are missing the point.

In the first Advent after he was elected pope, Pope Francis said, "The most important thing that can happen to a person

Pope Francis has said, "The most important thing that can happen to a person is to encounter Jesus, who loves us, who has saved us, and who gave His life to us."

We are Christ's witnesses to God's miraculous work in the world!

All of us experience God's miracles every day. Let us go out and talk about it!

Let us spend time talking with each other about how God has touched our lives.

Let us open the doors of the Church wide on Sunday Morning. Let us have greeters stand on the Bardstown Road Church Door, and the Parking Lot door, bulletins in hand, and invite people in.

Let us go out as evangelism calling teams every month. Let us set up a booth at the Farmer's Market and invite people to Sunday Services and Youth Group Events.

Let us talk about how the risen Jesus has called us into ministry and how our lives have been transformed!

I can't wait to grow together!

MARCH 27, 2018 SESSION SUMMARY

- For the devotion, Rev. Nebelsick gave each member of Session a copy of the Book of Order which is the foundation of Presbyterian Polity. We reviewed the index to be familiar with the contents. The devotion was closed with the singing of the hymn, "Spirit of the Living Good".
- Rev. Nebelsick stated in her Moderator's Report that "we are a life-giving multi-generational, multi-national and multi-ethnic congregation". She reviewed her activities during the past month including officiating at the baptism of Mary Caroline Purnell-Gatewood and participating in the HCM Lenten Luncheon Series.
- Future communions will be served by intinction due to the smaller size of the congregation.
- A walk from Louisville to St. Louis to promote the divestment of fossil fuels will start on May 27. BRP was asked to assist the participants.
- A new AT&T phone system is being installed which will save \$1,800 per year.
- The position for a custodian has been advertised to replace Woody who quit. Daniel Rapp has been doing some of the duties until the replacement is hired.
- The 2018 Operating Budget is requiring \$100,000 to be taken from our investments which will not be sustainable over the long term. A sound fiscal policy of the best use of our funds and budget is necessary. The budget will be discussed at the next Session meeting.
- Seventy-five large font bibles will be purchased for \$1,500 with the Schmid Funds and donations from the congregation.
- The job description for the Children and Youth Ministry Coordinator is being reviewed with limits set for responsibility for age groups and supervision. The position will be advertised in April so it can be filled in June after Brittany leaves.

NEW BIBLES


BRP has purchased NRSV Bibles with a large font.

ST. LOUIS WALK

May 31-June 1

Thanks to all the BRP folks who've agreed to house one or more of our guests for the night of May 31!

In case you missed last month's Newsletter article, we have several guests coming to Louisville on the 31st to get ready to walk to St. Louis. These guests are members of Fossil Free PC(USA), a group that's going to advocate for passage of the fossil fuel divestment overture at the General Assembly in St. Louis in mid-June. These out-of-town guests are going to arrive in Louisville on May 31 and begin their walk on June 1. BRP has agreed to feed these individuals a meal (in Fellowship Hall) on the evening of the 31st, host them for the night, feed them a light breakfast, and get them to the Presbyterian Headquarters building the morning of June 1 so they can begin the walk from there.

Walking to St. Louis (a distance of about 260 miles) will highlight the need for the GA to pass the divestment overture, so that the church (and its agencies) agree not to profit from the destruction that climate change brings to the planet. Fossil fuel companies are responsible for much of the greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change, so they are being targeted by the overture. So far, 39 presbyteries (including Mid-Kentucky) have concurred with the overture, so there is a lot of momentum across the country to pass this measure.

Please let the church office (451-8305) know if you can host one or more people coming to town on May 31.
